Guidance on claims made for the Chiropractic Vertebral Subluxation Complex

- 1. The chiropractic vertebral subluxation complex is an historical concept, but it remains a theoretical model.
- 2. It is not supported by any clinical research evidence that would allow claims to be made that it is the cause of disease.
- 3. Chiropractors are reminded that:
 - When practising, they must "select and apply appropriate evidence-based care which meets the preferences of the patient at that time." (Standard C5. The <u>GCC Code</u>: Standards of Conduct, Performance and Ethics for Chiropractors)
 - When advertising, they must "use only honest, legal and verifiable information when publicising yourself as a chiropractor, advertising your work and/or your practice including on your website. The information must comply with all relevant regulatory standards." (Standard B3. The <u>GCC Code</u>: Standards of Conduct, Performance and Ethics for Chiropractors)
